GOVERNING RULES

Any exhibitor intending to bring electrical equipment to the Show Grounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage breakers and that all leads, tools, and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a licensed contractor. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors and the general public and is a requirement of the **Workplace Health and Safety Act of 1995**. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions.

Any exhibitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Jandowae Show. Exhibitors should check all electrical equipment and leads before coming to the Showgrounds to avoid the occurrence of any difficulties.

All competitors and exhibitors are subject to the regulations and by-laws of the Jandowae and District Show Society Inc., which is affiliated with the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, and full particulars may be obtained on application to the secretary.

In the event of a protest, such protest shall be lodged, in writing, within half an hour of the event, with the secretary, \$10 to accompany the protest, which will be refunded if the protest is upheld.

The official office bearers of the Jandowae and District Show Society Inc, or their official representatives have the authority to remove an individual or an animal at their discretion should they deem the situation calls for such action.

Timetable for lodging exhibits: Times for lodging exhibits with Stewards are stated at the beginning of each relevant section. Exhibits must be in the hands of the Stewards at the times specified in the schedule to enable judging to commence at the time advertised. Failure to do so will mean exclusion from judging.

EXHIBITS MUST NOT BE REMOVED FROM THE PAVILION BY EXHIBITOR. PAVILION CLOSSES AT 6.00pm ON SHOW DAY. STEWARDS ONLY WILL HAVE ACCESS BETWEEN 6.00pm AND 6.45pm. ALL EXHIBITS WILL BE GIVEN TO THEIR RESPECTIVE OWNER AT 6.45pm. SHOULD THE EXHIBITOR BE UNABLE TO ATTEND AT THIS TIME, ALL CARE AND ATTENTION WILL BE GIVEN IN RETURN IN SAME TO THE EXHIBITOR.

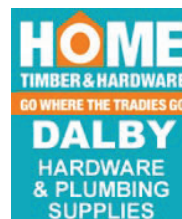

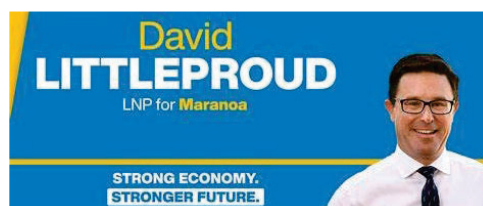

Competitors that are camping must follow the main entrance road to the right and follow to the camping designated areas.

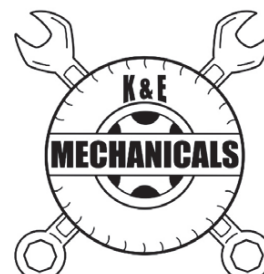
Classes in Ring 5 may have changes throughout the day depending on time allocation.

Exhibitors are asked to read conditions carefully. Please be aware that five rings will be running in unison. The stewards will do their best to ensure that the program runs efficiently as possible whilst exhibitors compete in more than one ring. Classes will not be delayed for longer than necessary.

Nominations - Nominations for all rings will be by ticket system. These will be available from main ring office from 7.30am. Tickets must be presented to ring steward before judging of a class commences. There will be no refund of entry fee if unable to compete. Ticket prices are stated in program for each ring.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

By entering Jandowae Showgrounds, all competitors and connections of competitors agree to abide by the following:

Common rules

1. Competitors and all others in charge of exhibit must obey the orders of the Stewards.
2. No exhibitor, nor a member of exhibitor's family, friends or employment are to approach the judge with regards to a decision made by the judge, unless they first obtain permission from Chief Ring Steward.
3. The Chief Ring Steward may alter or delete classes for program on the day.
4. The Committee takes no responsibility for theft, fire or otherwise.
5. Judges/ Ring Stewards/ Chief Stewards shall have the right to disqualify any exhibit or exhibitor if such exhibit or exhibitor is not able to be sufficiently controlled in a safe manner.
6. All horses competing in breed classes must be registered and must be able to produce papers on request.
7. No ring will be required to wait for a competitor in another ring.
8. Only competitors that are being judged are allowed in the ring at that time.
9. Cruelty to horses is forbidden on the grounds.
10. A person must not administer a prohibited substance to themselves or exhibits.

Stallions

1. All Stallions and colts must have a bit in their mouth whilst in hand.
2. The Chief Steward has the right to remove any stallion they consider unsafe from competition.
3. Stallions are not permitted in hack classes unless stated in the event. Stallions are permitted in hunter and bred classes.
4. All stallions must be handled by a person 18yrs and over.

Ribbons, Prizes and Awards

1. Ribbons shall be awarded to 1st, 2nd, 3rd at the minimum in hack classes. Prize money will also be allocated to placings and a placing card will be handed out with ribbons for place getters to hand in to hand in at ticket office to receive prize money.
2. Pony club ring 5 ribbons will be awarded to 4th placing.
3. Judges may withhold any championships honours if they think it expedient.

Protests

1. In the event of a protest, such protest shall be lodged, in writing within half an hour of the event, to the secretary accompanied with \$10 which will be refunded if the protest is upheld.

Ponies

1. Pony hacks can be ridden by a juvenile or adult but a pony that is 12.2 and under must only be ridden by a juvenile under 17 yrs of age.

Local Classes

1. Local means person or horse must reside within 55km radius of Jandowae or are a current financial member of the Jandowae Pony Club.
2. These classes are restricted, and winners are NOT eligible for Open Championships.

Maiden

1. A maiden is a horse who has never won 1st in a hack class at any agricultural Show.

Novice

1. A novice is a horse not having won a champion ribbon at an agricultural show.

Newcomer

1. A horse which has not competed under saddle at any show or competition prior to the 1st July 2023

Hunter Classes

1. A hunter is classified as a heavier horse with more substance than a modern hack. No coloured browbands or multi coloured attire on rider. Show hunters are not eligible to complete in open classes as written in schedule.

Riding Attire and Headwear

1. Any rider under 18 years of age riding a horse at Jandowae Show must wear an approved standard safety helmet whether in the ring or outside the ring. Approved Helmets are AS/NZS 3838 or EN 1384 or ASTN F1163.
2. Akubra style hats are acceptable wear in the performance classes by an adult, at rider's discretion.
3. Dress Code - Full riding attire must be worn in all ridden classes.
4. Appropriate attire may be worn in led classes.
5. Riding boots must be worn in all ridden classes.

For matters not covered by these rules, refer to the QCAS rules and regulations

Grand Parade Fancy Dress Horse/Pony and Rider**No entry fees**

To be judged while participating in Grand Parade at EST of 2pm. Winners will be announced, and all participants will receive a prize at the end of the Grand Parade.

Fancy Dress Rules:

1. Fancy dress horse or pony.
2. Child rider must be under 16 years.
3. All costumes must be safe for horse and rider and other competitors should be considered. Any costume deemed not safe by Chief Steward will not be allowed to enter event.
4. Riding helmet, boots, saddle and bridle must be worn.
5. Participants 6 years and under must be led, 7-12 years must have a handler present.
6. Only horse/pony and child will be considered in judging not handlers.

Conditions of entry:

1. All exhibitors will pay the gate entrance fee.
2. No Entry fee, No Prize fee.
3. Entries close 9:00am Friday before the show. All exhibits to be in the pavilion by this time. Early nominations appreciated, with the section card attached, and where possible, the name or variety. Separate exhibits must be provided for each class entered.
4. All grain to be in clean polythene, hessian or calico bag, or other suitable container, containing no less than 3 kgs, unless otherwise stated. All hybrid grains should be named. In a 2L ice-cream container with lid
5. Exhibitors are asked to carefully make sure their cards or tags match the schedule. If there is any discrepancy, return the tag at once to the Chief Steward, setting out clearly the class in which the exhibit should be entered and a new card will be issued.
6. Exhibitors must not, under any circumstances, alter cards themselves. Study the schedule carefully, and make sure that the exhibits comply with all conditions down. Failure to do so may mean the loss of an award.
7. By a "collection of articles" it is meant the greatest number of varieties. If the best half bushel or best half dozen are asked for, the quality, freedom from disease and general display are the principal considerations.
8. A "sheaf or sheaves" must be cut off above the ground and tied. For all grain sheaves, all leaf matter should be stripped from each individual stem, placed neatly together, tied in three places and cut off at the bottom. Zip ties can be used.
9. Wheat sheaves to be at least 6cm in diameter at the base. Grain Sorghum to be at least 10cm in diameter at the base.
10. Millet sheaves to be at least 5cm in diameter at the base.
11. Green forage and grass sheaves are to be at least 7cm in diameter at the base with free succulent leaves to be left on.
12. Honey entries to be in glass jars with screw top plastic lids.
13. POINTS - First place 3 points. Second place 2 points. Points will be halved where a tie occurs. NO additional points award for champion exhibits.

HINTS & PRESENTATION (BAKING)

- If using a fan forced oven, cook at approx 20 deg below recommended heat.
- Eggs should weigh approximately 2 oz.
- 1 tablespoon of syrup will replace an egg.
- If your butter is hard to cream, add 1 tbsp boiling water, this will also help to remove "sugar spots".
- Pour pikelet mixture from point of spoon to get a good shape.
- When making a sponge, beat egg white approximately 12 minutes.
- Plain sponge sandwich should be joined with jam, preferably raspberry.
- Use no more than 1 tsp butter in icing.
- A few drops of glycerin will make icing shiny & white and stop sweating.
- Orange cake should be iced with orange icing, on top only.
- Chocolate icing should match colour of cake.
- Shortbread should be a very pale straw colour.
- Boiled fruit cake should not be too rich, fruit and spices should give the required colouring.
- Over boiling of fruit cake will make fruit burst and cake will be dry (2-3 minutes boiling is sufficient).
- Top of fruit cake should be nice and glossy, to achieve this, wet your hand and pat top of cake before cooking.

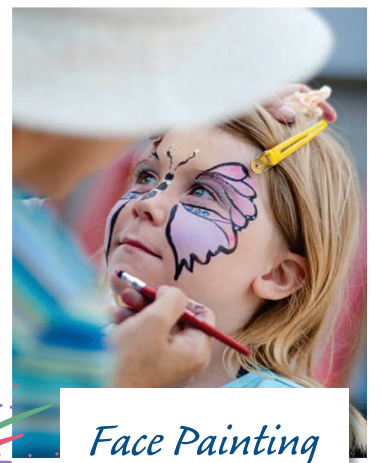
